

A sweet Polynesian dream

Your feet in the sand and your head in the sky... Every moment on board or during your stopover is designed to offer you a holiday with a change of scenery, between absolute rest, delight and *joie de vivre*.

The symphony of the senses

An enthralling look at the world

It's a peaceful night beneath the starry sky on board *Le Paul Gauguin*. Lulled by the gentle lapping of the waves, the ship glints and gleams with the reflections of the sky, first silvery, then orangey pink. Suddenly, the disk of the sun emerges from the horizon, setting the sky ablaze. A lagoon, displaying multiple shades of blue, sparkles before you. White sandy beaches are thrown into relief beneath luxuriant natural foliage. The serrated peaks of the mountains, magnetic, exert an irresistible attraction. The call of other kinds of forests, with corals in the place of trees, reverberates within you. Take your masks and snorkels and head off to see the multicoloured fish and manta rays that inhabit these undersea gardens.





Perceiving the singing of the elements

Sounds become dim and silence reigns beneath the surface. Or perhaps not. Listen very carefully, and the rolling of the waves, the swishing of the sands, the murmuring of the corals, the squeaking of seashells and the song of the dolphins give rise to a gentle, soothing symphony. On land, the vegetation, abundant and scented, is also rustling under a warm breeze. The air is vibrating to the rhythm of traditional drums. On the ship's deck, your Polynesian hosts are blowing into shells known as queen conchs. The wind blends with the orchestra and whispers in the ebony hair of the *Gauguines*, almost giving voice to their *mana*: the intangible character of that which is pure and wise.





Captivating island fragrances

The light breeze waving the hair carries exotic perfumes. A slow intake of breath transports you on a sensory voyage. You perceive first the captivating fragrance of monoï. The subtle perfume of tiaré flowers, formed into garlands, is sensed next, followed by notes of vanilla. On the island of Taha'a, its delicious aroma also reigns supreme, dominating the others; encounter the mostly widely cultivated and prized spice of the Polynesian archipelagos.

Exquisite exotic flavours

The scent of vanilla perfumes both the air of Polynesia and its traditional dishes. Coconut, fish, spices, tropical fruits... Awaken your taste buds to their rich flavours. On *motu* Mahana, our private island, the smell of a Polynesian barbecue brings the guests together for a time of friendly warmth and enjoyment. As you wander around, give in to the temptation of the various blends and mixes of flavours that reflect the Polynesians' refined art of living. Market delicacies, food tastings, food trucks, lunches by the water: a whole world of flavours are just waiting to be explored.

Delicate touches

The day slows, as if to the rhythm of deep, easy breathing. Movements become gentler, adopting a different pace. The sensation of touching becomes accentuated. The caress of the white sand on your skin, the gentle tickle of the tropical fish around you on your snorkelling adventures, the expert strokes of the masseurs keeping the art of *taurumi* alive, an ancient practice focused on letting go and featuring the use of local oils, flowers and plants... A voyage on which your whole world bathes in softness and everything becomes exquisite delight.

The journey to the end of the world is more than 15,000 km long, with a 25-hour journey and a 12-hour time difference. Crossing the planet, crossing time... Visiting these Pacific islands is worth it, and the change of scenery is such that you never really realise what you are experiencing. It took me 12 days of travel and a lot of memories to become fully aware of this.

My first reaction on boarding is that *Le Paul Gauguin* has a soul. It is a medium-sized ship with a bright decoration that contrasts with the dark wood of the furniture. Just the right balance between modernity and authenticity, in keeping with the destination. The spaces are both friendly and intimate. As the days go by, I find myself taking ownership of these pleasant places. I enjoy my breakfast at La Véranda restaurant, which is open to the outside, very bright, and decorated in a very

soft style. I can enjoy a cocktail at the cosy piano bar, where the bartenders take care of you – the whole crew is very attentive and quickly picks up on everyone's tastes – and melodies are played on the piano. I can sit on the sun loungers by the pool and watch the sunset with live music, either on my own or with other guests.

Moments outside of time

The atmosphere on board is friendly. It's nice to feel that I can talk to anyone. With many nationalities represented, the exchanges are all the richer. We feel that we are on a relaxing and epicurean journey. The *Gauguins* and *Gauguines*, the Polynesian hosts aboard *Le Paul Gauguin*, have a lot to do with it! They are so charming. Every day they organise activities and surprise us with dances and songs to the sound of the ukulele. And every day I learn a little more about their culture, their language,

the meaning of their tattoos... They made the arrival in Rangiroa a dream for me: we, the guests, were stationed on deck 9 to admire the entrance to the atoll. The *Gauguines* and *Gauguins* started singing and dancing which, combined with the scenery, made for a very enchanting scene.

I felt the same jubilation as the dolphins escorted us to our arrival in the Rangiroa channel, the sun disappearing below the horizon. They were having fun on the bow, as if to say goodbye. It was a moment that felt out of time. It must be said that the underwater fauna here is truly exceptional. For example, I participated in the black tip shark and stingray swimming trip in Moorea. I savoured every moment of this rare, once-in-a-lifetime encounter!

Conviviality at any time

On the land side, Fakarava was my favourite. This long atoll, like a beach that stretches to infinity, has a huge lagoon. No matter where you are, you can always see this beautiful blue. The fact that you can cycle across the width of the island in a matter of seconds gives you the feeling of being lost in the middle of nowhere, with the turquoise blue lagoon of paradise on one side and the wilder ocean on the other. The colourful houses, the small restaurants with their feet in the water, the lush nature and the brightly coloured flowers add a little more charm to this place. When we arrived on the island, a family welcomed us with traditional songs and dances. As we left, pirogues followed the boat back to the ship.

The pure moments of change of scenery followed one another and, combined, contributed to the magic of the destination! Beyond the idyllic landscapes and all their incredible colours,

I will remember the friendliness of the inhabitants, their heart-warming smiles, and their philosophy of life: "*It's all good*". It's a real shot of optimism and positive vibes!

At lunchtime, grilled meats prepared on the spot and coconut water directly from the fruit will satisfy the most demanding palates.











On this itinerary, you get to enjoy a full day on Raiatea (which replaces one of the two days on Moorea on the **Tahiti & the Society Islands** itinerary). According to legend, the island is the cradle of the gods because it is home to the earliest traces of local human habitation as well as the oldest place of worship in Polynesia – namely the Taputapuātea *marae*, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This platform was once a highly important political, ceremonial and funerary centre. The island also has a wonderful range of nature and wildlife to reveal to the curious who come to explore it.





For all cruises

The information below is valid only for French, Belgian or Swiss nationals at the time of this brochure's printing, in November 2022, and is subject to change without notice. For all other nationalities, please check the mandatory formalities for entering and leaving the countries visited during your trip with the competent authorities.

Passport valid for six (6) months after your return date. You are strongly advised to have at least two blank pages without any stamp in your passport. A page with ink marks or stamps (even small ones) cannot be considered a blank page. Passengers who deviate from the proposed embarkation and disembarkation programme must always check with the relevant authorities to find out about the customs formalities required for their trip.

Important information

Visas: before departure, you are advised to check that your visa's validity period matches the duration and dates of the stay requested, or you may encounter some unpleasant consequences if there is any non-compliance with the authorised duration of stay.


